History and terroir:

The vineyards of the Beaujolais region are linked to those of Burgundy. Burgundian vineyards are planted on clay-lime soils, whereas those which produce Beaujolais wines are on granite, shale or sandy soil. Red wines of Mâcon in the north and Gamay to the south are made exclusively using Pinot Noir.

Tasting:

A lovely gleaming purple coloured robe. Complex and intense with aromas of jammy dark fruits, notes of kirsch and spices enhanced by vanilla and mocha-flavoured fragrances. Full-bodied, rich and full with smooth tannins and a delicious finish with a hint of cocoa. A huge success! We recommend tasting this wine at 16-18 °C.
